Why does Hírdhe wear a Patkha on hís head?

Hirdhe is a Sikh



- Síkhísm orígínated ín Northern Indía about 500 years ago by Guru Nanak Dev Jí
- Sikhism is currently the 5th largest religion in the world
- □ The 1st Sikhs settled in the US as early as the 1800s

- Hírdhe's Grandparents came from Northern Indía to the United States in the 1970s
- Hírdhe's Father was born in White Plains Hospital and attended Greenville/ Edgemont Schools
- Hírdhe's Mother was born in India and was raised and educated in America
- Hirdhe's parents practice their Sikh religion and beliefs






Core Sikh Beliefs

The Many Types of Sikh Head Coverings




Rumal

Rumal: Small cloth that covers a combed bunch of hair with a rubberband

Patkha: Covers a Jurha (bun of hair) and is tied at the top of the boy's head














Keskis and Dastaar



Keskí

Keskí: Medíum sízed cloth for both gírls and boys who are older and can tíe by themselves

Dastaar (Síkh Turban): Large sízed cloth for gírls, boys, men and women


Who wears them?

- Only Sikh boys wear Patkhas
- Gírls wear Chunnís to cover their head
- As they grow both Sikh girls and Sikh boys wear Keskis and Dastaars (Sikh turban)
- 99% of all people in America wearing turbans are sikhs
- Sikhs are peaceful and humble







What is a Patkha?

A thín cotton píece of cloth dyed ín any color to cover, protect and keep uncut haír clean, together and groomed.

What does a Patkha look like?

- Rectangular shaped
 cloth with 4 strings
 at each corner
- Three of the sides are henned and the unhemmed side is placed on the forehead








Tying a Dastaar (Sikh Turban)







Gurpurab Festivities

Gurpurabs are on days throughout the year. On these days we honor the lives and teachings of the Sikh Gurus (Teachers).

Gurpurabs are celebrated in similar ways to Christmas, Hanukkah, Easter, Passover, Divali, Ramadan and other religious events in that Sikhs celebrate in their homes and have Gurdwara (Sikh Church)services with special importance given to each Guru's contributions, struggles and philosophy. Some Sikhs also Sing Hymns (Shabad Kirtan), Share Gifts and Do Community Service (Sewa).
